



Cause of occurrence

On 22.09.2011 a depression was formed over Northwest Bay of Bengal off North Orissa West Bengal Coast. As a result on 22nd and 23rd September 2011, heavy to very heavy rain was experienced over Brahmani, Baitarani, Budhabalanga and Subarnarekha basin due to the effect of depression over Bay of Bengal. As a result all the rivers of northern Orissa crossed the danger level and remained above danger level for four days.

1. Ex-gratia Payment to the families of deceased persons

42 persons died due to 2nd phase floods in the State in 2011. The requirement of funds as per revised CRF Norms for payment of ex-gratia assistance to the families of deceased persons for the purpose comes to **Rs 42.00 lakh**.

2. Clothing and utensils for families

About **88686** families whose houses have been fully damaged or severely inundated for a period more than 7 days have been provided with clothing and utensils. The district-wise expenditure for this purpose is given below:

3. Gratuitous Relief for families in dire need of immediate sustenance after a calamity

The affected persons who were in dire need of immediate sustenance after the floods were provided with Gratuitous Relief for 7 to 15 days @Rs.20/- per adult per day and @Rs.15/- per child per day. The total expenditure incurred towards providing gratuitous relief comes to **Rs 2000.00 lakh**.

5. Cost of de-silting of agricultural land

747.60 hectares of agriculture land have been sand cast due to this flood. An amount of **Rs.44.86 lakh** is required for removal of sand to make the land fit for agriculture purpose.

6. Agriculture input subsidy to farmers where crop loss is 50% and above

An amount of Rs. 7245.52 lakh is required for providing input subsidy to the small and marginal farmers who have sustained crop loss of 50% and above due to the current flood. Similarly, Rs.149.30 lakh is required towards agriculture input subsidy for farmers other than small and marginal farmers. District wise details is at **Annexure-A**.

7. Replacement of draught animals

46 large animals and **792** small animals have lost lives due to floods. The total expenditure for replacement of these animals comes to **Rs.15.25 lakh**.

10. (a) Traditional Crafts

52 Artisans belonging to Bhadrak Districts have been affected due to the current floods. Extensive damages have been caused to their equipment. 136 Artisans have also lost their raw materials. An amount of **Rs.3.74 lakh** is required for providing subsidy to them as per the revised CRF Norms.



(b) Handloom Weavers

455 loom equipment and accessories of **455** beneficiaries have been damaged due to this floods and need replacement. An amount of **Rs.18.20 lakh** is required for providing assistance to the beneficiaries as detailed below:

11. Assistance for repair / restoration of damaged houses

17178 houses have been fully damaged and **41397** houses have been severely damaged. **79906** Houses have been partially damaged. This apart, **36013** Huts have also been damaged. An amount of **Rs.4859.15 lakh** is required for providing assistance for repair / restoration of the damaged houses of affected people. The detail expenditure as per revised CRF/SDRF Norms is given in **Annexure-B.**

12. Emergency supply of drinking water in rural areas and urban areas :

For immediate provision of drinking water to the flood victims 1501700 water pouches have been distributed. Tube wells are being disinfected immediately after receding the flood by the deploying 72 For immediate provision of drinking water to the flood victims 2247000 water pouches have been distributed. 13. Medical Care for cattle & poultry against epidemics:

Vaccination of Livestock in the affected districts have been made to reduce the morbidity and mortality of the livestock. Health and Deworming camps were also conducted to check different contagious and infectious diseases. An amount of **Rs 92.00 lakh** is spent for the purpose

14. Evacuation of affected people:

174874 persons were evacuated by means of hired vehicle to safer places. An amount of **Rs.95.33 lakh** has been spent towards cost of POL and hire charges of vehicle.

15. Hiring of boats for carrying immediate relief and saving life

733 nos of power boats were engaged in relief and rescue operation in the flood-affected Districts. The relief materials were also transported by boats. The affected persons were also evacuated by boats. A sum of **Rs.91.25 lakh** has been spent towards hiring charges and cost of POL etc. for boats.

16. Provision for temporary accommodation, food, clothing and medical care

667 relief camps were also opened to accommodate 266702 people who were evacuated by different means. An amount of **Rs.362.27 lakh** was spent towards cost of providing temporary accommodation, food, clothing and medical cares in the relief camps.



17. Temporary shelter materials

58575 families whose houses have been either washed away or severely damaged were provided with polythene sheets for use as temporary shelter materials. The total amount spent @Rs.1000/- per family is **Rs.585.75 lakh**.

18. Air-dropping of essential supplies: -

Five Helicopters were engaged for air-dropping of essential commodities for relief operation. Approximately **Rs.240.00** lakh is required for payment of bills of helicopters of IAF & Indian Navy.

Medical equipments and medicines amounting to **Rs.85.50 lakh** of Govt. Hospitals in Keonjhar & Jajpur district have been damaged and lost due to this flood. Hence Rs.85.50 lakh is required for replacement of these damaged medical equipment and lost medicines.

Draining of flood water in affected areas:

Due to submergence of vast area under 12 ULBs in flood water for a longer period, it was necessary to prioritise the work of dewatering, sludge removal and sanitation measures towards Hygienic condition. **Rs.352.57 lakh** has been spent for the above purpose.

Cost of Search and Rescue measures:

Ten ODRAF units were engaged for search and rescue operation in the flood affected areas. An amount of **Rs.22.00 lakh** has been spent for the purpose.
