ACTIVITIES OF INDUSTRIES DEPARTMENT-2008-09.

The Department of Industries is responsible for the industrial development of the State. In furtherance of this objective, initiatives are being taken by the Department to put in place a robust policy framework for facilitating industrial promotion and investment. The Department emphasized on leveraging the abundant mineral and other resources of state and promote maximum value addition creating employment opportunities for the people of the State. For the purpose, industrial Policy Resolution 2007 has been put in place which emphasizes deregulation, simplification of rules and procedures to enable a conducive business climate and facilitate ease of doing business in the State.

In response to the initiative taken by State, large number of investment proposals in various sectors in mineral based Industries such as Steel, Power Aluminium Special Metal (Titanium Products) and Cement has been received. In the meantime, the State Government has signed 79 MOUs on various industrial sectors like Steel, Aluminium, Cement, Oil Refinery, Auto Ancillary, Special Metals and Power with a total investment of Rs. 3,65,327.20 crore. 28 projects under Steel, 1 project under Aluminium, 1 project under Cement and one project of Auto Ancillary Sector have gone into partial production with an investment of Rs. 34 thousand 5 hundred 71 crores 51 lakhs generating employment of 20 thousand 1 hundred 03 persons directly. 21 projects under Steel, 21 projects under Cement, 2 projects under Aluminium, 1 project each under Special Metal (Titanium product) and Oil Refinery of OICL are under progress. The State has been the destination for quality investment in IT and ITES sector industries. Big industrial houses and multi national companies including POSCO, Arcelor Mittal, Jindal Steel and Power, Jindal Stainles, Aditya Birla Group, Vedanta Alumina Limited are on the process of setting up of their industries in the State.

Industrial and social infrastructure of high standard is sine-qua-non for a sustainable industrialization. Such physical and social infrastructures are being developed through Public Private Partnership (PPP). PPP Policy of the State is in place and a PPP cell has been established in the P & C Department to rope in private investments in infrastructure development.

To make Orissa an important hub for domestic and international markets in chemicals and petrochemical sectors, a Petroleum, Chemical and Petrochemical Investment Region (PCPIR) is being proposed at Paradeep with Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL) as the anchor tenant. Once fully developed, the annual turnover of the PCPIR would be around Rs. 423,500 crore with an anticipated annual export of Rs. 43,000 crore. It will generate nearly Rs. 42,000 crores of tax revenue which will boost the regional as well as national economy. The direct employment in the proposed PCPIR would be 2.27 lakhs with an indirect employment potential of 4.21 lakhs.

Keeping in view the export potential of the State, an Export Policy is in the anvil. To maximize the impact of the current flow of investment in the industrial sector, thrust is being given to promote forward and backward linkages between large, small and medium industries through ancillary and downstream industries and a comprehensive MSME Policy has been in place for the sustained growth of MSME sector.

The Directorate of Technical Education and Training Orissa is producing technicians /craftsman from Engineering School and Polytechnics/ITI and ITCs to cater to the manpower

requirements of the existing as well as upcoming industries of the State. Now efforts are on to upgrade the Government ITIs in to Center of Excellence with domestic funding and World Bank Assistance since the year 2005-06. The Directorate is also presently encouraging the Educational Entrepreneurs of the State to set up new ITCs/ Polytechnics in each District and Block so as to enable the rural poor to get technical training facilities. The industrial Houses / Business Houses of the State are also being involved with the Government ITCs/ Polytechnics to make of the training programme employable and to have better on the job training facilities.

For industrial development in the State, Industries Department has four Directorates namely, Directorate of Industries, Directorate of Handicraft and Cottage Industries, Directorate of Technical Education & Training and Directorate of Export Promotion and Marketing. Apart from above four Directorates the Department has a number of Corporations mainly discharging the activities with broad objective of promoting and facilitating the industries in the state.

BRIEF NOTE ON BUDGET PROVISION FOR 2008-09 AND 2009-10

- Budget is being prepared for both Non-Plan and Plan Schemes.
- Non-Plan Schemes meant for staff salaries.
- Plan Schemes meant for development work.
- Under Plan Schemes, there are four Sectors-(1) Large & Medium, (2) Village & Small Industries, (3) Technical Education and (4) Craftsman Training.
- Village & Small Industries Sector is of two parts-(1) Small Scale Industries & (2) Handicraft Industries.
- Plan Schemes are of three types-(1) State Plan (2) Central Plan and (3) Centrally Sponsored Plan.
- Under State Plan Schemes, the budgetary provision is met from state's own resources.
- The funds under Central Plan Schemes are being provided by Govt. of India.
- Funds under Centrally Sponsored Schemes are being provided by both State Govt. and Govt. of India as per the ratio fixed in each Scheme.
- Under State Plan Schemes, there were 18 Schemes under Large & Medium Sector, 23 Schemes under SSI Sector, 14 Schemes under H&CI Sector, 10 Schemes under Technical Education Sector, 9 Schemes under Craftsman Training Sector during the last financial year 2008-09.
- Similarly there were four schemes under Central Plan Schemes during the last financial year.
- Under Centrally Sponsored Schemes, there were twelve Schemes during 2008-09.
- During the current financial year, New Schemes have been incorporated in different Sectors.
- Thus, as against 90 schemes in 2008-09, there are 102 Schemes in 2009-10 under different Sectors during 2009-10.

DIRECTORATE OF INDUSTRIES

Incentives to Small Scale Industries and Large & Medium Industries.

The Directorate of Industries, Orissa is functioning under the administrative control of Industries Department, Government of Orissa for promotion of small scale industries, ancillary and downstream industries implementation of PMEGP programme and supervision of 30 District Industries Centres (DICs) all 30 revenue districts in the State. The following are its major activities.

Electricity Duty (E.D.) Exemption

New Industrial units with contract demand upto 110 KVA and captive power plants will be entitled to exemption of electricity duty for a period of 05 years from the date of power supply/ date of commissioning of the plant during the year 2008-09. 04 No. of Industrial units have been allowed to avail ED exemption. For the year 2009-10. It has 20 units.

Issue of eligibility certificate for payment of premium for conversion of Agriculture land to industrial purpose.

New units and existing units taking of expansion/ modernization/ diversification will be granted exemption from payment of premium for conversion of agriculture land to industrial purpose. For this year 2009-10 it was proposed to grant eligibility certificate to 30 industrial units.

Interest Subsidy

All new SSI/ existing SSI taking of E/M/D and sick industrial units availing industrial term loan which have started commercial production between 1st April, 2003 and 31.03.2007 are eligible to get interest subsidy @ 5% of term loan per annum for a period of 5 years at a ceiling of Rs. 20 lakh for SSI and Rs. 10 lakh for Toney industries. As per restriction imposed by Planning and Coordination Department, the maximum limit of interest subsidy will be Rs. 1.00 lakh per unit and units covered under PMRY/PMEGP will not be eligible for interest subsidy. During 2008-09, an amounting to R. 4, 64,474/- has been sanctioned against 15 Nos. of SSI Units.

Sales Tax Reimbursement

New SSI units and existing SSI units taking up for KBK backward areas and units in approved cluster, priority sector, ancillary sector in other areas, which are started production between 01.04.2003 to 31.03.2007 are eligible for Sales Tax reimbursement for a period of 5 years limiting to 100% of fixed capital investment.

Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) to be set up

During the year 2008-09, 4806 Nos. of MSME units with investment of 29,203 lakhs have been set up and providing employment opportunity to 21,135 Nos of persons. During the year 09-10 it has been proposed to set up 5000 Nos. of units with an investment of s. 30,000 lakhs to provided employment to 30,000 persons.

Registration of EM Part-I and II to MSMEs.

During the year 2008-09 (till October, 08) 2003 Nos. of EM -I and 246 No. of EM-II were issued to SSI Units.

Capital Investment Subsidy (CIS) to SSI and Large & Medium Industries.

Under the provision of various industrial policies, CIS is being sanctioned to SSI and Large & Medium Industries. During the year 2008-09, an amount of Rs. 10, 73,750/- (up to October, 2009 has been sanctioned in favour of 2 SSIs Units).

(1) Cluster Development Programme

Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) possess inherent potential for generating economic growth, alleviating poverty and bringing about equitable development. But, problems associated with size and their inability to achieve the economy of scale, power for negotiation, specialization, access to strategic information etc. very often restrict the envisaged role of MSMEs. Strengthening the linkage between MSMEs, large enterprises and support institutions is a strategy to address some of these issues. Cluster approach, which is based on sectoral and geographical concentration of enterprises having common opportunity and threat, s a mode for strengthening the linkage in sustainable manner.

Ministry of MSME, Government of India have announced Micro & Small Enterprises Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP)- earlier known a Small Industries Cluster Development Programme (SICDP)-which provides financial assistance both for soft (Capacity & social Capacity building) & hard (Common Facility Centre) components.

(2) Singe Window at District Level Nodal Agencies (DLNA)

Creation of conducive & investor friendly environment being the most important parameter for attracting both domestic as well as foreign investment for rapid growth of industrial activities in the State, Government have adopted the concept of Single Window Clearance mechanism.

The objective of the system is to ensure:

- ❖ Faster and one-point clearance of industrial projects, and
- ❖ Single point dissemination of industrial project related information to prospective entrepreneurs for expeditious investment decisions.

“Orissa Industries (Facilitation) Act, 2004 and Orissa Industries (Facilitation) Rules, 2005” have announced for the purpose. District Industries Centers have been declared as DLNA.

Achievement

- ❖ Extended Single Window mechanism to all DICs. Total number of applications received 847.
- ❖ Business Facilitation cells being created in 13 DICs & 2 DIC building under construction.
- ❖ ITC equipment provided to 27 DICs.

Food Processing Sector

- ❖ National convention on Agro & Food Processing Industries was organized during celebration of “Entrepreneurs Week-2008” on 8th March, 2008 at Swosti Plaza, Bhubaneswar.
- ❖ Meeting with ITC regarding investment proposals and projects in Orissa held on 13.11.2007 for integrated manufacturing and Food Park in Balasore IE, in & around Bhubaneswar and Cuttack.
- ❖ Meeting on “Promotion on Food Processing Industries in Orissa” held on 03.10.2007 for building of a quadrangle of entrepreneur- technology-credit-infrastructure.

Auto component manufacturing unit by M/s. RSB Transmission (I) Ltd.

MoU has been signed between Government of Orissa and M/s. RSB Transmission (I) Ltd on 6th December, 2006 for establishment of an Auto Component Manufacturing unit at Mania, Choudwar which is first of its kind in Orissa, So far, 23 crores has been invested creating employment for 87 persons in the State and the for going plants has gone into production.

Purphase Statistics of PSUs

The purchase statistics of the Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) are compiled quarterly, by which the market prospects of MSEs have been monitored in a regular basis. Total purchase made from inside the State is 41.42 Cr. and outside purchase is 29.41 Cr. by October, 2009.

Draft Policy for Special Economic Zone (SEZ)

The SEZ Act and Rules provide legal framework and fiscal regime to attract qualitative domestic and foreign capital investment with a high degree of export orientation. Till now, 14 SEZs have got approval from Government of India.

Post management Review Committee (PMRC)

The PMRC is established on 16.04.2007 for monitoring the preparedness of the Sea Ports of Orissa and a working group has constituted to look into the facility of setting up Inland Container Depots (ICDS) at Rourkela, Jharsuguda and Kalinganagar and similar industrial hubs in the State on PPP Mode.

WTO Issues

“World Trade Organization Preparedness Monitoring Committee” has been constituted by the State Government for development of Industry Agriculture and Services in the State within the Frame Work of the WTO on 07.06.008. “WTO Cell” has been constituted in IPICOL under the Industries Department on 07.06.2008 to create awareness and build capacities of the industries, Entrepreneurs, affairs and other concerned in the matter relating to WTO.

(3) Steps taken for Development of Ancillary and Downstream Industries.

To attract investors for Ancillary and Downstream Industries in metal sector of the existing and upcoming Large/ Mega projects, investment promotion road show cum exposure visit by “Team Orissa” has been conducted in the current year as stated below.

- ❖ “Team Orissa” ha participated in “ALUCAST-2008” at Chennai during 11th-14th December, 2008 for Ancillary and Downstream Industries development in Aluminium sector.
- ❖ “Team Orissa” has participated in the state session “ADVANTAGE OISA”, at science city Kolkata organized by CII on November 20th 2008.
- ❖ “Team Orissa” has participated in interactive session on “Investment Opportunity in Orissa” on 23d November at New Delhi during IITF 2008.
- ❖ Monitoring of Plant Level Advisory Committee (PLAC) and Plant Level Consultative Committee (PLCC) for development of Ancillary and Downstream Industries of the Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) & Large/ Mega Industries in Private Sector respectively.

Other activities

- ❖ Meeting on development of Ancillary and Downstream Industries has been held under the Chairmanship of the Hon’ble Chief Minister Orissa on 20.10.2008 in the Chief Minister’s Conference Hall.
- ❖ 1st meeting of the “Core Group” on “Fly Ash/ Blat Furnace Slag Mission”, Orissa has been held on 09.05.2008.
- ❖ Formulation of SEZ Policy under process.
- ❖ Formal Approval of Government of India has been granted for the SEZ by TATA Steal in Ganjam.
- ❖ Monitoring of Aluminium Park at Angul, Food Park at Khurda, Apparel Park in Khurda District.

- ❖ Monitoring of existing institutional mechanism for revival of sick industrial units i.e., DLC, Sub-SLIIC and SLIIC.
- ❖ Review on progress in financing and rehabilitation of sick SME by the Empowered Committee.
- ❖ Action Plan on revival of sick industrial units for the year 2007-08 has been prepared and communicated to all GM/PM, DICs.
- ❖ Performa for identification of sick industrial units has been devised and communicated to all GM/PM, DICs for identification of sick units.
- ❖ District-wise target (2007-08) for revival of sick industrial units has been fixed and communicated to all GM/PM, DICs for achievement.
- ❖ Proposal for strengthening of SLIIC has been prepared and sent to Government for necessary approval.
- ❖ Steps has been taken for constitution of “MSME Development Consortium” for identification of sick MSME for revival and identifying & selecting viable projects for development of new MSME basing on the core strength of the State.

(4) PMRY/PMEGP

PMEGP a central plan programme is being implemented through KVIC, OKVIB & DIC for creation of self as well as wage employment avenues in Industry, Services & Business route since 2008-09.

(5) Credit flow to MSME Sector

In the recent past rapid industrialization has been taken place in the state as many as 69 MoUs have signed by Government. Depending on the existing and up-coming Large Scale/ Mega Projects, large number of Ancillary and Downstream Industries will be coming

up. Keeping in view Banks have to play an proactive role for increasing credit flow to MSMEs. The SLBC has decided for doubting the credit flow in MSME Sector by 2009-10.

Panchayat Samity Industries (PSI)

The Panchayat Samity Industries programme was introduced during the year 1961-62. These are small scale industries generally set up as Industrial Co-operatives and their name is derived from the fact that they are located within the area of Gram Panchayat and the Panchayat too participated utilizing share capital.

The aim and objectives of this programme are:-

- (a) To promote industrial climate in the rural area.
- (b) To provide employment to the rural people.
- (c) To have better utilization of local resources, local skill and raw-materials etc.
- (d) To provide better return to the agriculturists and artisans.

Under this programme, 147 Nos. of PSI units were set up on various categories of Engineering and non-Engineering activities. Since the year 1993-94, many of these PSI units are sick/ defunct due to various reasons such as inadequate finance, obsolete technology, marketing and managerial problems etc.

Employment Mission:

- ❖ Under the Employment Mission Scheme, 8006 unemployed youths have been trained. It is proposed to impart training to 14,000 youths under employment mission during 2009-10.
- ❖ During the current Financial Year 2007-08, an amount of s. 3077.43 lakhs and Rs. 4492.94 lakhs have been provided for imparting Craftsman Training & Technical Training Scheme respectively.

BIJU PATNAIK UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY (BPUT), ORISSA ROURKELA

The Biju Patnaik University of Technology, Orissa Rourkela was established by an Act of Orissa Legislative Assembly in June, 2002. The University became operational on 06.11.2002 with the joining of its first Vice Chancellor. The first batches of students were taken through Joint Entrance Examination, Orissa in August, 2003. The University today has about 168 colleges, both constituent and affiliated colleges. Various disciplines like engineering, architecture, business management, hotel management, computer studies and pharmacy are offered by this University.

Constituent and Affiliated Colleges of the University.

The University has 66 Engineering colleges (including 4 constituent colleges); 39 MBA colleges (including 2 constituent colleges); 42 MCA colleges (including 2 Constituent colleges); 16 Pharmacy colleges; 2 Architecture (including 1 Constituent colleges); and 1 Hotel Management & Catering Technology college. These are available in 121 institutions and these include 2 upcoming constituent colleges of the University i.e. Parala Maharaja Engineering College, Berhampur & Government College of Engineering, Kalahandi, Bhawanipatna to be started in 2009. The total student strength is around 78000.

Centers of Excellence of BPUT

2008-09

Five (5) Centers of Excellence have been broadly envisaged in teaching and research in frontier areas. These centers are: (i) Center for Micro Electronics (already started in 2008); (ii) Center for Nano- Biotechnology (started in 2009) and M. Tech. programme has already been started.

Future Plan for Establishment of Centers in 2009-10

(i) Center for Steel and Basic Metals, (ii) Center for Robotics, (iii) VLSI and Embedded Systems, (iv) Center for Non-destructive Testing. These would operate as independent unit with a networked structure within the University.

Academic Programme at Bachelor's and Master's Level

The University offers undergraduate B. Tech. Programmes in 23 disciplines (available in 66 Engineering colleges), Bachelor of Pharmacy (16 colleges), Hotel Management (1 college), Post graduate (M. Tech.) programmes in 7 disciplines (available in 14 colleges), M. Pharm Programme in 5 disciplines (available in 10 colleges). MBA programme in 39 colleges. MCA Programme in 42 colleges and M. Arch. Programme in 2 colleges.

Doctoral Programmes

The University has started doctoral programmes mostly in Engineering, Pharmacy and Management areas. 78 students have registered for the above programmes. 5 scholars have already submitted their thesis and shall be awarded the degrees. Two scholars have already been awarded Ph.D. degree.

Linkage with Advanced Institutions.

A MOU has been signed with IIT, Khargpur for enhancing the quality of teaching at the UG/PG level engineering. Some programmes in specified areas are about to begin. A similar MOU with XLRI, Jamshedpur has been entered into for improving the MBA programme.

A MOU has been signed with NITTTR, Kolkata to train the teachers. Also a MOU has been signed with 24 X 7 e-clearing for providing e-books to the students. These would however be outside the direct curriculum meant for enhancing the skills of students that are vital for employability today.

A MOU has been signed by 3-parties (University of Siegen, Germany, M/s Brockhaua GmbH and BPUT) for enhancing the quality of its IT teaching at the UG and PG level, 06 numbers of students are now undergoing 6 months training programme at University of Siegen, Germany.

Welfare Schemes

The main features of welfare schemes offered by the University are:

- ❖ Financial support to students whose financing parents/ guardians pass away or become incapacitated during the study period.

Infrastructure & Manpower of BPUT

- ❖ The land earmarked for the campus at Rourkela is roughly 133 acres; the boundary wall here has been completed. Student's activity center, Administrative building, Library-cum-computer center is to be completed soon. Administrative approval has been given to IDCO for construction of the Academic Blocks and quarters.
- ❖ The University is now housed in a part of building of a polytechnic (UGIE) in Rourkela with about 30,000 sq. ft. of space; It is about to occupy another 6000 sq. ft. in the same building.

DIRECTORATE OF EXPORT PROMOTION AND MARKETING, ORISSA, BHUBANESWA.

Directorate of Export Promotion and Marketing, Orissa, functioning as a Promotional organization to render marketing assistance for increasing for increasing exports and also for providing marketing assistance to the SSI units of the State. Three non-plan schemes viz., (i) Directorate of EP&M (ii) Testing Laboratories (iii) Quality Control of House Hold Electrical Appliances and one State plan scheme i.e., up-gradation of testing Laboratories are implemented in the Directorate to provide marketing assistance to SSI units and Export assistance to the Exporters for promotion of export. Marketing assistance is rendered by way of Registration of Industrial units, Conclusion of Rate Contracts, controlling quality of the products manufacturing by the Industrial units through periodical inspections and drawing of the samples and their tests in its Testing Laboratories located at Cuttack, Rourkela, Angul, Bolangir, Balasore and Berhampur.

During the year 2008-09 (till November, 2008), 14 SSI units have been registered with the Directorate and registration fees of Rs. 6350/- has been collected.

Establishment of Design Cell:

Under the scheme Design Development under Handicrafts, a design cell has set-up by SIDAC at Handicrafts Complex, Gandamunda, Bhubaneswar in association with NID, Ahmedabad. One designer and 2 associate designers have been recruited for the design cell. The designers have undergone training for a period of 2 months in NID, Ahmedabad. Also 15 MCMs in different craft attended the course curriculum testing & demonstration workshop conducted by NID, Ahmedabad. A sum of Rs. 30.00 lakh is placed in advance with IDCO for construction of Design Cell building.

Rehabilitation of Handicrafts artisans.

654 nos. of artisans are assisted under RHA scheme by providing margin money assistance @ 20% of the project cost subject to maximum limit Rs. 5000 in order to avail bank loan. Further 700 nos. of applications are under process at bank level. For this a target of 800 has been fixed.

Promotion of Handicraft Enterprise:

09 nos. of artisans are assisted under margin money assistance scheme @ 15% of project cost subject to maximum limit of Rs. 7500 for setting-up of individual handicraft enterprise.

Strengthening of Industrial Co-op. Societies:

An amount of Rs. 9.00 lakh has been sanctioned under the scheme strengthening of Industrial Co-op. Societies for construction of 3 nos. of work-shed for 3 ICS.

Skill up-gradation training under Employment Mission:

An amount of Rs. 123.25 lakh has been sanctioned and Rs. 61.61 lakh has been released in 1st phase for implementation of self employment programme under Employment Mission. Training for 1511 artisans in different crafts has been organized in KBK districts.

Revival of Languishing Craft:

ORISSA INDUSTRIAL INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (IDCO)

Orissa Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (IDCO) has been established in the year 1981 with the specific objective of creating infrastructure facilities in the identified Industrial Estate/ Areas for rapid and orderly establishment and growth of industries, trade and commerce. Consistent with this objective, IDCO has established / managed 86 Industrial Estates / Areas all over the State. Besides, acquisition and allotment of land to the industries in medium and large sector, assisting them in infrastructure development has been another prime function of this corporation. In addition to the above works, it takes up various construction activities entrusted by State and Central Government Departments and their corporations on agency or contract basis. It provides escort services to investors/ developers for implementation of mega projects in the State in the infrastructure sector.

This ISO 9001 & ISO 14001 certified Corporation has achieved the unique distinction of being the only State level organization to be conferred the “**Golden Peacock**” award by the Institute of Directors, New Delhi for adopting and maintaining quality management standards in all its operations.

PROGRAMME FOR 2008-09

In 2008-09, the Corporation has proposed an investment of Rs. 48.44 crore in different infrastructure projects under Plan scheme. Under diversified activities, there is a programme to execute works worth of Rs. 93.00 crore on agencies and contract basis. Besides, investment in land acquisition for major projects is also envisaged for Rs. 295 crore at various project sites. Thus the total turnover of the Corporation for the year has been estimated at Rs. 437.34 crore.

ACHIEVEMENT

Plan Scheme Works:

- ❖ At Jharsuguda Growth centre, Phase-III development works have been planned over Ac. 150 of land with an estimated cost of Rs. 410 lakh at Site-1. Acquisition of AC. 135.44 is at advanced stage at Jharsuguda for road development work at Bolangir Growth Centre, tender processing is under finalization.
- ❖ Development works of IID Centres at Khurda and Somanathpur have made substantial progress and scheduled for completion by 31.03.09. Allotment of land at both the centres is in progress.
- ❖ Development of Food Processing Park, Khurda is in progress and scheduled for completion by March, 09.
- ❖ Urban Haat Puri is in advance state of completion.

Infrastructure project under PPP mode:

❖ Development of Special Economic Zones:

Establishment of 12 SEZs have been approved by Govt. of India out of which 4 projects have been notified.

❖ *Haridaspur-Paradip Railway line:*

78 ms. Broad Gauge rail link is being developed jointly by Rail Vikas Nigam Limited, IDCO, Paradip Port Trust Limited and Use Industries through SPV M/s Haridaspur Paradip Railway Company Limited (HPRCL). IDCO has participated in the SPV through equity contribution of Rs. 1.80 crore. Shareholders Agreement has been signed. Rs. 1.80 crore has already been deposited by IDCO with M/s HPRCL.

❖ *IT & Commercial Complex, Rourkela:*

Objective to provide quality built-up space for IT/ITES, Corporate offices, social infrastructure such as retail & shopping, entertainment & leisure etc. About 3.0 lakh sft of built-up space over 3.12 acres of land in Civil Township. M/s Forum Projects Pvt. Ltd have emerged as Preferred Bidder after open competitive bidding process. IDCO Board & Govt. approval has already been obtained. LoI has already been issued to the preferred bidder.

❖ *Bio-Pharma IT Park:*

To develop Orissa as a hub of research, development and innovation in the fields of Bio-IT and Bio Pharma related areas, a dedicated Park has been planned for development. Ac. 53.229 acre land at Andharua near Bhubaneswar is under transfer to IDCO. M/s. Bharat Biotech International Limited has been selected as preferred bidder after open competitive bidding process. Lease-cum-Development is to be signed soon.

❖ *Petroleum, Chemical and Petrochemical Investment Region (PCPIR):*

An SPV namely Paradeep Investment Region Development Limited has been formed for development petroleum & petrochemical industries at Paradeep region. Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. and Paradeep Port Trust have been requested to join the SPV. M/s IL&FS have been entrusted with preparation of project documentation. Govt. of India has been requested for approval of the project.

❖ *Information Technology Investment Region (ITIR)*

Ministry of Communications & Information Technology, Government of India recently approved a Policy Resolution on setting up of Information Technology Investment Region (ITIR). The Policy will help to promote investment in the IT, ITES/ Electronic Hardware Manufacturing Units (EHM). The region would boost would boost augment exports and generate employment. Accordingly, in a meeting taken-up by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 10.07.2008, it was decided to set-up an ITIR in Bhubaneswar. M/s IL&FS has been engaged to provide advisory services for the project. The project proposal is under preparation.

❖ *Dhamara Industrial Township*

Consequent upon establishment of Dhamra Port Company Limited (DPCL) a joint venture Company of L & T and Tata Steel and being the deepest port of India and expected to be ready for commercial deepest port of India and expected to be ready for commercial operation by March, 2010 and availability of huge amount of Government land, the Board of Directors of IDCO in its meeting held on 20.09.2008 has decided for development of a township at Dhamra to provide support to ancillary and downstream industries to come-up near the port.

❖ Info valley

500 acres of Government land in Jatin Tahasil has been identified for development of Info Valley. Government of India has accorded Formal Approval for Development of SEZ over the land. The Info Valley project would be developed in PPP mode. M/s. IL&FS has been engaged for preparation of project proposal and master Plan for the same.

❖ World Trade Center

IPR-2007 (Para 9.12) provides that “IDCO shall promote a World Trade Center (WTC) at Bhubaneswar to promote global networking and give international visibility to the industrial potential of the State”. Accordingly, Industries Department has been requested to facilitate identification and transfer of suitable Government land for establishment of the World Trade Center.

❖ Project Management Unit (PMU) setting up in IDCO

As per the terms of Project Development and Promotion Partnership (PDPP) agreement signed between Government of Orissa /IDCO and IL&FS for development of infrastructure in the State, a Project Management Unit (PMU) shall be functioned in IDCO. Accordingly, a PMU is functioning in IDCO under the direct supervision of the Management Director.

❖ Industrial Infrastructure Up-gradation Scheme (IIUS)

Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP), Government of India have provided assistance to the State for development of industrial clusters under Industrial Infrastructure Up-gradation Scheme (IIUS). Accordingly, it was decided to prepare three proposals or Mancheswar , Balasore and Jharsuguda or Rourkela. IL&SF IDC has been entrusted to prepare the project proposals. One proposal i.e. for Mancheswar has already been prepared by the IL&FS and the same has been sent to the Industries Department for examination and onward submission to DIPP.

❖ Land Acquisition:

IDCO is the ‘NODAL AGENCY’ for identifying and acquiring land both from Government and private parties at strategic locations. The land so acquired is allotted for industrial as well as infrastructure projects. During 2008-09, Ac, 5278.47 of land has been allotted to 28 industrial units. Turnover

The Corporation made a turnover of Rs. 385.93 crore in 2007-08 For the year 2008-09, the turnover has come to Rs. 710.21 crore (Provisional) as on 31.03.2009 against the target of Rs. 437.34 crore . This has been possible due to large scale land acquisition taken up by the Corporation.

ORISSA INDUSTRIAL PROMOTION & INVESTMENT CORPORATION ORISSA LTD (IPICOL)

The Industrial Promotion and Investment Corporation of Orissa Ltd. (IPICOL) was incorporated by Government of Orissa in 1973 with the main objective of accelerating the pace of industrial development of the state by promoting large and medium scale industries.

During the year, IPICOL has played a significant role in dispersal of industrial into backward areas. Orissa is emerging as the leading state in production of Steel, Sponge Iron and Alumina / Aluminium. These resource-based projects are labour intensive and based on local resources.

Industrial Promotion and Investment Corporation of Orissa Limited (IPICOL) is the State Level Nodal Agency (SLNA) to function as the single point contact for the investor and also as the Secretariat for High Level Clearance Authority (HLCA) and State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLSWCA). IPICOL receives the Combined Application Form (CAF) and forwards to the concerned Departments/ Agencies for their comments and approvals. IPICOL's project appraisal is then placed with HLCA and SLSWCA for a formal approval. During the 08-09 (Jan) 66 numbers of proposals with a proposed investment of Rs. 3, 00,135.46 Crores has been cleared by SLSWCA. The main objective of a MoU is to provide the investor a comfort-level regarding State Government's support and facilitation to the project.

A large number of mega projects are in the pipeline. During the last 5 years 72 MOUs have been signed for setting up steel, alumina, cement and power plants in the State. During the period 2007-08, SLNA in IPICOL has received 42 Combined Application Forms (CAF) for setting up projects with investment of about Rs. 83354.76 crore in the State.

IPICOL in the process of implementing a computerized Project Monitoring Information System (PMIS) for tracking the Combined Application Forms (CAF) submitted for Single Window Clearances. This will also enable investors to submit CAF online and know status of their application. This will facilitate effective communication for clearance through single window system and generation of summary report on investments made.

IPICOL functioning as Team Orissa's secretariat has been in the forefront of Investment Promotion by taking initiatives to put Orissa on the radar of global investors. IPICOL has evolved its role over the years and graduated into the full-fledged Investment Promotion Agency of the State. This transformation has taken time, but today IPICOL has proven its capacity to showcase the business and investment potential of Orissa within the county and abroad.

The Investment Promotion team from IPICOL has participated in a number of events, both in the county as well as abroad. Such outreach activities have provided them an opportunity to meet investor's one-to-one and provide them requisite information to attract investments for the State. Some of the noteworthy events are-

- ❖ Participated in international event pertaining to the Engineering sector such as Handover Mess 2007 at Germany.
- ❖ National events.

- ❖ Conducted Road Show on opportunities in Ancillary & Down Stream sector of Steel at Hisar, Haryana and Ludhiana, Punjab.
- ❖ Study Tour to Chennai by Team Orissa officials to get first hand knowledge on how single window mechanism has been introduced and implemented by the government of Tamil Nadu. A report to this effect has been submitted to Industries Department.
- ❖ Participated in ALUCAST-2007 at Jaipur, Rajasthan. This is the flagship event of the Association of Aluminium Castors of India. Team Orissa also organized a road show to promote Orissa as an emerging aluminum hub in the county. Emphasis was given to development ancillary and down steam industries in the sector.
- ❖ Facilitated the launch of the South Africa Help Desk at the Orissa State Productivity Council campus and organized interaction meeting o the Deputy High Commissioner, Sough Africa with regional entrepreneurs for building mutual business relationship.
- ❖ Conducted workshop and seminars on Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) and Industrial Policy Resolution (IPR)
- ❖ Participated in events conducted by CII (Enterprises Orissa-2007), OSPCB, and India International Trade Fair (IITF)-2007, New Delhi, India Engineering Meet & Exhibition (IEME), Delhi, India Engineering Technology Fair 2007, New Delhi.
- ❖ Signed MoU with Japan External Trade Organisation (JETRO) and organized business interaction meeting with the 18-member Japanese business delegation from Kitakyushu region with corporates from Orissa.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF ORISSA LTD **(IDCOL)**

The Industrial Development Corporation of Orissa Limited (IDCOL) was set up in 1962 with the objective of establishing and promoting large and medium scale industries in the State.

In the process of promoting Industries for value addition and optimum utilization of rich mineral resources of the State, it has set up as may as 15 industrial units at different parts of the State. The multi product and multi-unit conglomerate was having interest in Pig Iron, Spun Pipe, Ferro Chrome, Cement, tor-steel, transmission line tower, enables, jute products, cotton yarn, chrome chemicals and fasteners etc.

IDCOL was one of the professionally managed State PSU having track record of running in point for years together. Shouldering the social responsibility it has set up industry

in no Industry district. It has provided employment to more than 10,000 employees directly and equal number indirectly. It was a major contributor to the State GDP and was also a major contributor to State exchequer.

As a part of the Public Sector Reforms Policy of Government, the sick subsidiary companies were divested/ asset wee sold. Presently, it is continuing as holding company of following subsidiary companies only.

- ❖ IDCOL Kalinga Iron Works Limited (IKIWL) at Barbil engaged in manufacturing of foundry grade Pig Iron and Cast Spun Pipe.
- ❖ IDCOL Soft Ware Limited at Bhubaneswar, which acts as one of the nodal IT agents of the Government.
- ❖ Konark Jute Limited, Dhanmandal engaged in Jute products.

In addition, one Iron Ore Mine at Roida 'C', Barbil and one Chromite Mines at Talanagi are under operation by IDCOL.

ORISSA STATE FINANCIAL CORPORATION

Orissa State Financial Corporation is a premier state level financial institution came in to existence in 1956 with the enactment of SFCs Act, 1951 to cater the need of industrial development in the state of Orissa; it took up the challenges of solving mass unemployment, better utilization of natural resources available in the state, it provides loan assistance for setting up industries in small scale and medium scale in consortium finance with state level financial institutions like IPICOL and Commercial Banks it extends term loan up to Rs. 1.50 Crore per project/ unit for acquisition of fixed assets for setting up industrial units under Tiny/SSI/Other than SSI sector etc. besides, the corporation extends financial assistance for expansion, diversification, modernization & revival of potential viable units. The credit delivery network of OSFC is being taken up by its 17 branches covering the entire state which provide services at the door steps of the customers.

OSFC has contributed significantly to the development f small-scale industries and employment generation in the State in its fifty years of existence. However, due to a variety of factors OSFC's financial performance has been very poor, which has made it unviable in its present state. The low level recovery caused by the high level of sickness in the Small Scale Industries (SSI) sector in the State has resulted in 92 percent of non-performing assets (NPA) in its loan portfolio of bout Rs. 467 crore (principal). Apart from low recovery the other factors which have contributed to the financial losses to OSFC are the high cost of rising from cottage and village industries to small and medium industries which require multiple expertises. The cumulative loss has gone up to Rs 380.91 core in 31.03.07.

Taking in to account high level of NPA in one hand and rapid industrial development in other hand, the State Govt. appointed UTI Bank Limited as consultant to formulate Restructuring package of the ODFC. After examining all respects UTI Bank Ltd. furnished the report during the March 2004. Board of OSFC, IDBI & SIDBI has approved the restructuring package. The State Government during December 2006 has approved the

financial and organizational restructuring of the Corporation which is now under implementation.

The Orissa Small Industries Corporation Ltd. (OSIC), Cuttack

The Orissa Small Industries Corporation Ltd. (OSIC) was established in the year 1972, as a wholly owned Corporation of the Government of Orissa with the main objective to aid and assist the SSI units of the State of other State Corporations looking after the various aspects of industrial development, OSIC is the only Corporation of the State which is exclusively engaged for the development of the SSI units, which form the backbone of the industrial sector of the Country.

The present functions of the Corporation are as follows:

- ❖ to provide quality raw materials to SSI units at reasonable prices.

- ❖ to provide marketing support to SSI units.
- ❖ to help the SSI units in exporting their products.
- ❖ to assist and establish SSI units in the State by providing equity support to them whenever necessary.
- ❖ to provide incentives to the SSI units as per the industrial policy resolution (IPR) of the Government of Orissa.

A brief description of various schemes operated by the Corporation is as follows:

Raw Material Assistance Scheme:

Under this scheme, the Corporation provides various types of raw materials to SSI units as per their requirement. For this the Corporation operates 12 nos. of raw material depots spread all over the State. At present the Corporation is dealing with a wide range of raw materials like Iron & Steel, TISCON Bars, Aluminum Ingots, Plastics, Bitumen and Coal etc. The Corporation has appointed 53 dealers all over the State to spread the TISCON Bar business. Strategies have been planned out to overcome the problem and constraints faced in the previous years and the Corporation has prepared the annual budget for the year 2008-09 and expected a turnover of Rs. 237.00 Crore under this scheme and achieved a turnover of Rs. 237.00 Crore. In the year 2008-09, the Corporation achieved a turnover of Rs. 287.62 Crore for the year 2008-09 making a profit of Rs. 4.46 Crore.

Orissa Khadi & Village Industries Board

The Orissa Khadi and Village Industries Board is a statutory organization constituted on 15.06.1956 for organizing, developing and regulating Khadi & village Industries activities in the State. The Khadi & Village Industries Commission (KVIC), Mumbai provides funds in shape of grant and loan for implementation of KVI programme. The Board is implementing the schemes/ programmes as per the guidelines issued by the KVIC from time to time. The KVIC extended finance under pattern of Assistance from 1956 to 1996. Consortium Bank Credit scheme from 1996 to 1999 and Rural Employment Generation Programme from 1999 to 2008.

Then Khadi and Village Industries Commission has introduced a new scheme namely Prime Minister' Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) in the year 2008-09.

PATTERN OF ASSISTANCE

The Board has extended financial assistance through 1865 cooperative societies to set up KVI units in the State including 337 Artisan Multipurpose Industrial Cooperative Societies at least one in each block.

CONSORTIUM BANK CREDIT SYSTEM

The Board has extended finance directly to 358 individual under Consortium Bank Credit scheme through cooperative Banks and Regional Rural Banks. These CBC scheme has been discontinued by KVIC from the year 1999.

RURAL EMPLOYMENT GENERATION PROGRAMME

Gramodyog Rojgar Yojana, also known as Rural Employment Generation Programme (REGP) is being implemented in the State since 1999, through the scheme was introduced on adhoc basis in 1995-96. Under REGP, all village industries with upper limit of Rs. 25.00 lakh can be financed through banks to Individual Artisans/ Entrepreneurs/ Institutions/ Cooperative Societies/ Self Help Groups in rural area.

Besides financing individual beneficiaries/ entrepreneurs, the KVIC providing funds in shape of margin money subsidy upto 75% for development of cluster area, marketing support, design development, common facility centre under the 'Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industry's (SFRUTI) and 'product & Development Design Intervention & Packing' (PRODIP) under REGP.

PROPOSALS

The Orissa Khadi & Village Industries Board has proposed to KVIC to establish a Mini Honey Processing unit with project cost of Rs.16.25 lakh in the premises of the Board under RISC programme.

KHADI

Out of 40 Khadi Societies / Institutions, 36 Societies have been provided with financial assistance under Pattern of Assistance Scheme by the Board and the rest 4 Institutions have been financed under interest subsidy scheme. Out of these 40 societies, 7 societies have land of their own (without building) & 20 societies have building of their own, Khadi Certificate has been renewed in favour of 5 Board aided Khadi societies.

During the Super Cyclone in the year 1999 and heavy flood in 2001, Khadi along with Gramodyog activities have suffered a set back as the societies sustained serve damage. One high level review meeting under the Chairmanship of H.E. the Governor of Orissa was taken on 11.02.2006 in the presence of Chairperson of KVIC for revival of the Khadi activities. As per the decision taken in the meeting, necessary steps have been taken to assess the loss and to remove the bottlenecks being faced by the societies. An interim status report on Khadi activities has been sent to Govt. in Industries Department vide Orissa Khadi & V.I. Board letter No. 324 dated 08.01.2007. Steps has been taken to revive the activities with assistance of the present Government providing arrear rebate claim, infrastructural facility, marketing support, raw material & setting up of processing units.

PROGRAMME FOR 2008-09: PMEGP

The Khadi and Village Industries Commission, Mumbai has implemented a new programme namely "PRIME MINISTER'S EMPLOYMENT GENERATION PROGRAMME" from 2008-09 merging existing scheme of REGP & PMRY.

The KVIC will act as the nodal agency at the National Level and the scheme will be implemented through KVIC, State Officers and KVIB in the rural areas of at the State and through District Industries Centres in both rural and urban areas.

The District Task Force Committee under the Chairmanship of District Magistrate & Collector of concerned district will meet once in a month to scrutinize the applications, conduct interview and forward the selected applications to the bank for sanction.

The KVIC has allotted physical target of 736 units with financial assistance of Rs. 8.84 crore as margin money under PMEGP for 2008-09 is annexed.

ORISSA FILM DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION LTD

The Orissa Film Development Corporation Ltd. Cuttack is a promotional agency for growth and development of film industry in the state. The corporations are functioning since April 1976 and have been implementing different schemes under the plan and programme for development of film industry in the state.

❖ Construction of Cinema Halls

This corporation has devised this scheme for extending loan to the entrepreneurs for construction of Janata and Rural Cinema halls in the state. Besides the corporation is extending loan for renovation and remodeling of existing cinema halls.

❖ Subsidy to Cinema Halls (Refund of E.T.)

In respect of new cinema houses, the amount collected by way of Entertainment Tax excluding surcharge tax on exhibition of advts and show tax for first two years after its commissioning if given a subsidy to the concerned cinema halls through the Orissa Film Development Corporation Ltd. as per the rules of the Corporation and approved by the State Government from time to time.

2. PRODUCTION OF FILMS IN THE STATE.

❖ TERM LOAN TO PRODUCERS FOR PRODUCTION OF FILMS.

This corporation has formulated this scheme with a view to encourage the producers for production of Oriya films in the state. By the end of 2006-07, the corporation has sanctioned Rs.3.51 Crores towards Term Loan in favour of 41 nos. of producers.

During the year 2007-2008, the corporation has not released any amount in respect of the Term Loan in favour of any producer for production of Oriya feature film.

However, the corporation has received number of applications from different producers for productions of Oriya film, which is under consideration of the committee and the loan shall be extended looking into the financial position of the corporation.

However, it is proposed that during the year 2008-09, a sum of Rs. 75.00 lakhs will be extended to the film producers as Term Loan for production of 05 nos. of Oriya films.

❖ SOFT LOAN TO PRODUCERS FOR PRODUCTION OF FILMS.

This corporation has formulated this scheme with a view to encourage the producers for production of Oriya films in the State. By the end of 2006-07, the corporation has sanctioned Rs. 1.55 Crores in favour of 101 nos. of producers towards Soft-cum-Bridge Loan.

During the year 2007-08, the corporation has not sanctioned Soft-cum-Bridge Loan in favour of any producer for production of Oriya film. Also a number of applications are pending which is being considered by the corporation to extend finance looking into funds position.

It is proposed that during the year 2008-09, a sum of Rs. 20.00 lakhs will be extended to the film producers as Soft-cum-Bridge Loan for production of 05 nos. of Oriya films.

❖ **SUBSIDY TO FILM PRODUCERS.**

With a view to encourage the producers for production of film in the state the corporation has formulated such scheme for extending subsidy to the producers. This scheme has been implemented after due approval of the State Govt. and as envisaged in the IPRs.

❖ **RECOVERY OF LOANS**

The corporation has taken all out effort for realization of the corporation dues by way of personal contact, issue of notices, filing of certificate cases under OPDR Act. In deserving cases, the certificate cases have been transferred to the concerned District U/S 12 for execution and attachment of mortgaged properties. Also the corporation undertakes joint drive with the Certificate Courts. Through this process a substantial amount is being realized through courts.
