

ROLE AND FUNCTION OF DIRECTORATE OF EMPLOYMENT,ORISSA.

Employment Organisation in Orissa works under the direct supervision of the Labour & Employment Department, Govt. of Orissa. Under the Directorate of Employment, Orissa eighty (80) offices are functioning at different levels. There are thirty (30) District Employment Exchanges, five (5) Special Employment Exchanges, one (1) State Employment Exchange (Professional & Executive), four (4) University Employment Information and Guidance Bureaus, thirty three (33) Employment Sub-offices and seven (7) Rural Employment Bureaus. The Director of Employment is the head of the Employment Organisation in the State. It is basically a regulatory body that ensures effectiveness of work, implementation of policy & procedures and takes appropriate action to bring about necessary improvements in the employment scenario. Broadly with four Sections i.e. Vocational Guidance Section, Exchange Section, Employment Market Information Section and Occupational Information Section. The Employment Exchanges present in different pockets of the State carry out the job of Registration, Submission, Placement, Vocational Guidance, Collection and Compilation of Employment Market Information, Interpretation of Statistical Data, Verification of records of establishments under the provisions of the Employment Exchanges Compulsory Notification of Vacancies Act. 1959 and Rules 1960.

Detail statistics on Registration, Notification, Submission, Placement and Live Register of the State (**From 2000 to - 2007**) is as follows :-

Due to shrinkage of job openings in Public Sector organizations there is gradual decline in placement over the years.

Apart from the routine works of Registration, Placement etc the Directorate of Employment has taken up the following schemes as new initiatives towards generation of employment/self-employment opportunities.

DISSEMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE TO JOB-SEEKERS

For information of job-seekers and students Employment Exchanges play a vital role, especially in far and remote areas of the State. The following measures have been taken up for information dissemination and employability of the job-seekers.

RECRUITMENT IN DEFENCE AND PARA MILITARY SERVICES :

Lack of salaried job opportunities in the organised sector has become the key concern of the State and hence there is an effort to explore alternate avenues. Defence and Para-Military Forces have a large opening for the jobseekers. For successful organisation of Recruitment Rallies Employment Organisation has been entrusted to provide logistics support to the Recruiting Team. Generally accommodation, transport, medical cover, law and other arrangements etc are provided during the Recruitment Rallies.

Advertisements from the Defence and Central Para-Military Forces are received in advance for making adequate publicity and arrangements for Recruitment Rallies. Massive publicity measures are being taken up to cover the remote areas of the State through Print and Electronic media in order to have maximum representation from Orissa.

Similarly, all possible logistics support is provided to '9' Airmen Selection Centre, Bhubaneswar for recruitment to Air Force whenever they organise recruitment tests and conduct educational and motivational programmes in schools and colleges.

Intimations are sent to all *Panchayats* in response to advertisements for Defence and Para-Military Recruitment Tests. At the local level, publicity measures are undertaken by the concerned District Employment Officers who display banners and posters at prominent places of their district. This has resulted in tremendous response from remote areas of the state. As per the report received **1052** number of candidates

have been selected in Defence Services during **2005-06** and **723** candidates during **2006-07**. **1236** number of candidates have been selected in Para-Military Services during 2005.

SETTING UP OF STUDENTS' INFORMATION BUREAUS AND MODEL CAREER CORNERS IN SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES OF THE STATE

This organisation has been providing Vocational Guidance to job seekers and students through Career Talks, Career Conferences, Career Exhibitions, publication of vocational guidance bulletins, dissemination of information on different careers and self-employment ventures etc. To promote Vocational Guidance activities in the State **22 Model Career Corners** (in Women's College and in Girl's High Schools in tribally dominated and backward districts) and **12 Students' Information Bureaus** (in leading colleges of the State) have been set up. **16,446** number of students utilised the Students' Information Bureaus and **11,858** students utilised the Model Career Corners in the year 2006.

FUNCTION OF VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE UNITS

For dissemination of information and to bring about awareness among the students and jobseekers of the State, the functions of Vocational Guidance Units cover the following areas of guidance activities:

- (i) To provide individual information to assist the jobseekers in choosing their careers.
- (ii) Collection and compilation of occupational information with a view to disseminate these information to the needy jobseekers, educational institutions, parents and teachers.
- (iii) To provide career information, career literatures, posters, highlighting various job opportunities and publishing career bulletins for the benefit of the jobseekers.
- (iv) To organise career conferences, career talks, career exhibitions etc. in educational institutions on different careers and self-employment ventures.

In the present day context because of fast shrinkage of salaried jobs in the labour market, self-employment as a career assumes a momentous significance. With the vast reservoir of job-seeking labour force waiting on Live Register rolls, Employment Exchanges have got a key role to play in motivating the job-searching youth to opt for self employment as a career and identifying persons endowed with entrepreneurial potential.

PRINTING OF CAREER BROCHURES IN ENGLISH AND ORIYA

As a major drive, this Directorate has taken the initiative to print 36 career brochures on different professions. Apart from it all the University Employment Information & Guidance Bureaus in the State have been publishing Career Bulletins on a regular basis.

EMPLOYMENT MARKET INFORMATION

Employment Market Information (EMI) Unit present in all District Employment Exchanges is responsible for collection of regular information about employment in Private Sector as well as in the Public Sector. This is being done under the “establishment reporting system”. All establishments in the Public Sector and selected establishments in the Private Sector (those employing 25 or more persons) engaged in non-agricultural activities are required to furnish details about the numbers of persons they are employing, vacancies that have occurred therein and the type of persons they find to be in short supply regularly. The above information is collected under the provision of the Employment Exchange (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959 which has made it obligatory on them to render to the local Employment Exchange employment and occupational returns prescribed under the Employment Exchange (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Rules, 1960. Information from smaller establishments employing 10-24 persons in the Private Sector is however collected on a voluntary basis. Detail statistics regarding number of Public Sector and Private Sector establishments and number of employees with male-female break-up for the **June, 2006** - Quarter is given below:
